

## **Ottawa Substance Abuse Prevention Coalition**

Convening organizations contributing to Substance Use Disorder Prevention, setting strategic priorities, mobilizing for action and data driven decision-making, addressing emerging drug trends, ensuring coordinated efforts, and implementation of strategic action plans.

## **OSAP Steering Committee**

Role: Ensures strong coalition functioning, oversees coalition policy, and provides subcommittee technical assistance.

## **Reducing Ottawa Area Drunk Driving Taskforce (ROADD)**

Why/Role: Address the harm due to high-risk alcohol use and impaired driving.

Goal: Addresses youth access to alcohol, impaired driving and high risk drinking by young adults.

## **Student Leaders Initiating Change (SLIC)**

Why/Role: Youth Subcommittee to include youth voice.

Goal: Engaging peers to build leaders and encourage healthy choices.

SLIC Core creates student messaging and Above the Influence activities. Local school based SLICs help implement SLIC messaging in their local schools.

## **Quadrant Subcommittees**

Why/Role: Engage and educate parents and implement strategies at local and school level.

Goal: Address substance use trends specific to jurisdiction, conduct parent and community education efforts, provide support for school participation, assist with dissemination of efforts created at county level. In some communities, these are key partnerships rather than subcommittees that meet.

## **Building Resilient Youth**

Why/Role: Address mental illness.

Goal: Ensure teens are supported in getting help for depression and suicide ideation to prevent teen suicide and build resilient youth.

## **Cannabis Reduction And preVention Education (CRAVE)**

Why/Role: Address recreational marijuana legalization.

Goal: Advocate to reduce availability of marijuana and educate the community on the science of marijuana.

## **Partner Coalitions**

Coalitions that are not subcommittees of OSAP, but have similar goals, and work collaboratively with OSAP.

## **Ottawa County Suicide Prevention Coalition**

Works to prevent adult suicide and promote mental health in Ottawa County.

Lead agency is Ottawa County Department of Public Health.

## **Prescription Drug and Opiate taskforce**

Works to minimize the impact of the Opiate Crisis in our community through prescriber education, community education, medication disposal and narcan distribution.

Lead agency is Ottawa County Community Mental Health.

OSAP partners with the Opiate Taskforce to specialize in community and parent education.

## **TalkSooner**

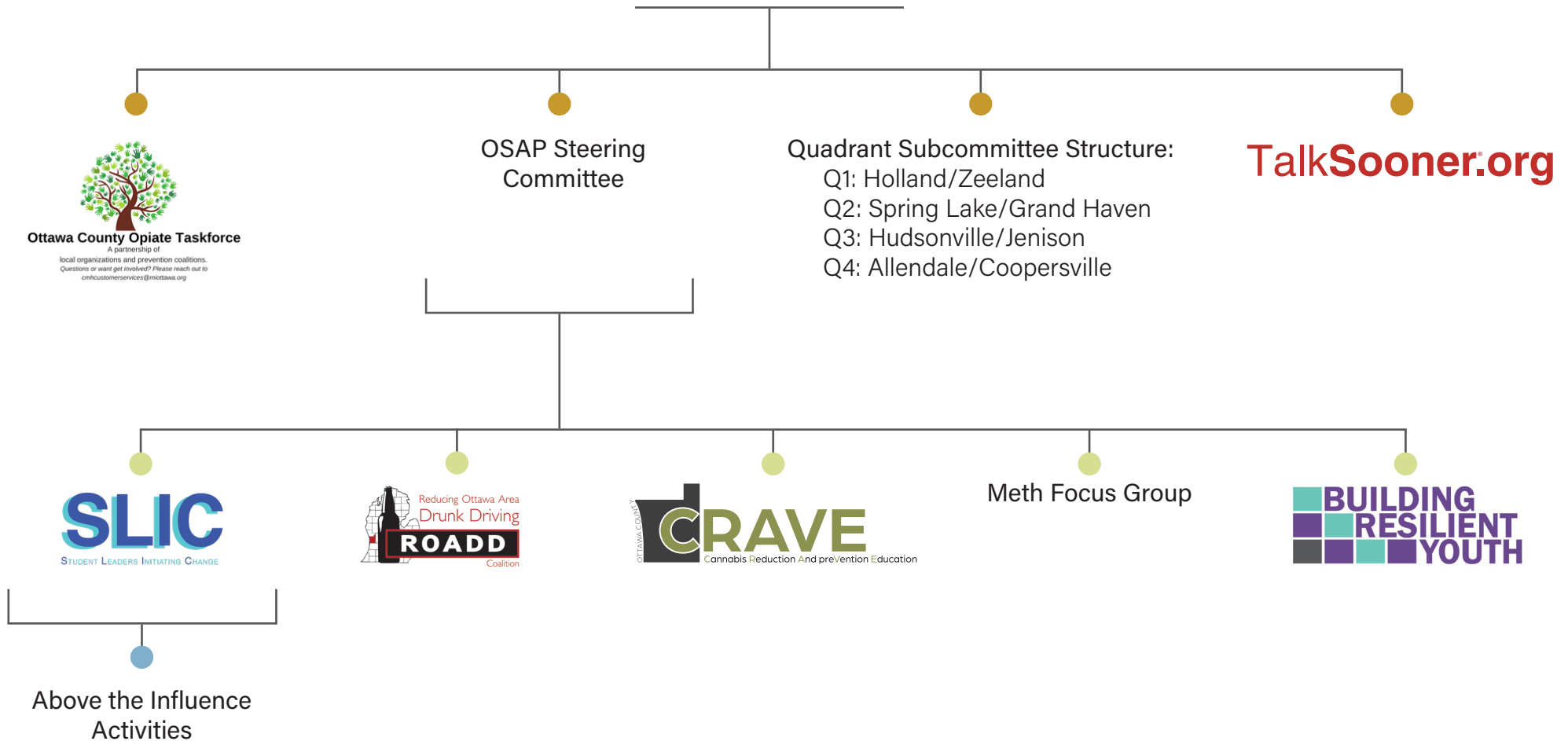
Works to prevent youth substance use throughout West Michigan by encouraging healthy parent/child conversations through parent education.
