

EXAMPLE: Raise Your Voice Pre vs. Post Survey Results (Middle School)

Purpose: High school students are trained in peer refusal skills and are empowered to teach these skills to middle school students and prepare a presentation for them. This report shows the results of the surveys that the middle schoolers took before and after the presentation is shown to them.

Definitions: Percent change is the final (post) value minus the original (pre) value divided by the original value. This is different than the percentage change which is only the final value minus the original value. We use the percent change in our analysis.

Respondents:

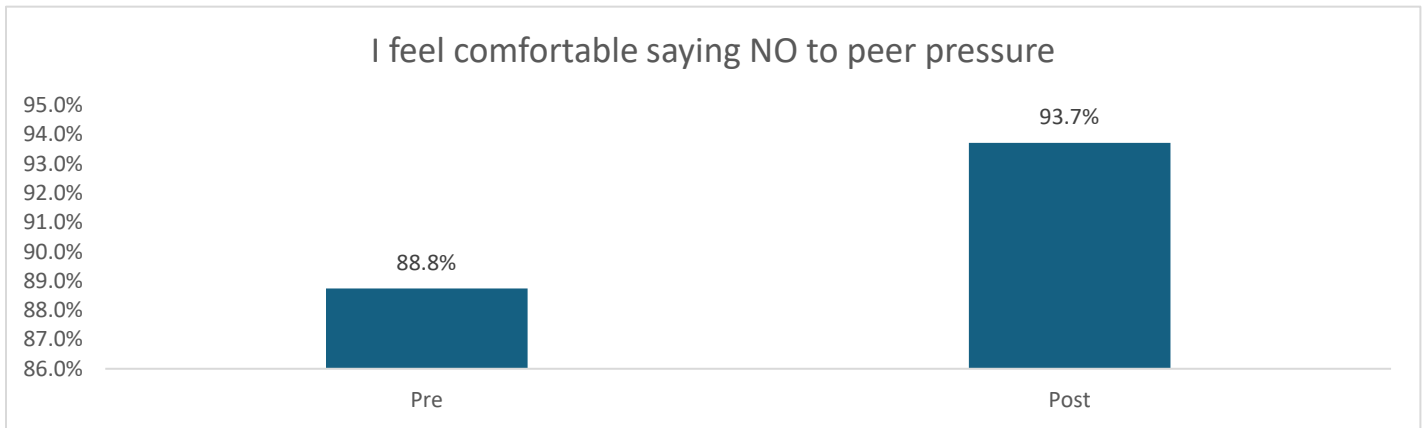
Total middle schoolers surveyed for the pre-survey: **557 students**

Total middle schoolers surveyed for the post-survey: **481 students**

Survey is taken across 3 different middle schools, within 2 school districts – Holland and Hudsonville.

Key Findings:

1. As shown in the bar chart below, we saw a 6% increase in students who agree or strongly agree that they feel comfortable saying no to peer pressure.



2. We also saw an 11% increase in students who agreed or strongly agreed that they could do something to stop a fight between students if they felt like something was about to happen.
